Families, use this to prompt conversations at the table, in the car, and anywhere else your family experiences life together.

- What are some situations where listening to someone in charge is very important? Why is it especially important to listen to Jesus?
- How can we practice listening to Jesus as a family?
- How do you like to spend time with Jesus?
- What are you learning from spending time with Jesus?



Story Time Listening

Listen to Luke 10:38–42 as a family. Have a family member read it aloud, or listen on a Bible app. As you listen together, invite each family member to write down or draw a picture of what stands out to them most about the story. Listen to the story two or three times, and see if you notice a different detail and note if something else stands out to you. After listening and responding personally, share what you learned with each other. Discuss these questions together:

- What stood out to you in this story?
- What message did Jesus share in this story?
- How did listening to the story more than once change your experience of it?
- How can we make listening to Jesus part of our family rhythm?



Family Prayer Cards

Jesus invites us to spend time with Him. Create prayer cards that are specific to your family and will help you bring your requests to God. Store these cards where you regularly spend time together and use them as guides to reflect on your day and share prayer requests.

Gather notecards or cut cardstock or construction paper into rectangles. Write a prayer prompt on one side of each card. Use crayons or markers to decorate and personalize each card.

Here are some ideas to get started (fill in the blanks with your specific praises or requests):

•	"Thank You, God, for being"
•	"Help me remember to come to You when I feel"
•	"We praise You because You"
•	"God, You are amazing because You"
•	"Help me to know I can come to You when I need

Consider keeping blank cards on hand so that you can add to your family prayer cards when a new request arises or when you want to thank God for answering a specific prayer.
