

WALK IT ACT IT MOVE IT

Wonder Walk

God's love transforms and makes things new. We see this as we grow in Jesus and become more like Him as the Holy Spirit leads us.

As a family, write each letter of the alphabet in a column on the left side of a sheet of paper. Then take your paper and go on a nature walk together at a park or in your neighborhood. On your walk, name all the living things you see. Find as many as possible that start with different letters of the alphabet. As you find them, fill them in on your paper. As you discover each item, talk about what those things would have looked like several months ago. For example, the baby birds may not have hatched yet, the tulips may have still been bulbs in the ground, or the trees may not yet have sprouted leaves.

As you walk, talk about how God's love transforms us as well. As we become more rooted in His love, God makes us more like Jesus. We can grow in His love and show others more of what God is like. God's love transforms us!



Delicious Transformation

As a family, bake something delicious together to think about how God's love transforms.

Choose a simple baking recipe online or from a cookbook that includes baking soda. You may want to make baking soda biscuits, chocolate chip cookies, or Irish soda bread.

Baking soda is an important baking ingredient. Baking soda is a leavening agent that makes gas bubbles. These bubbles rise to the surface of dough and cause it to rise. Baking soda transforms a lump of dough into a fluffy cookie or loaf of bread!

As your dough bakes, allow your child to watch from a safe distance through the oven window to see the dough rise. As you eat your delicious creation, talk about how God's love transforms us and makes us new!
